ACT OF SECURITY OF THE INTERNAL AFFAIRS OF THE WORKERS' STATE OF HELASIA

The Department for Diplomacy of the Bureau of External Affairs of External Affairs of the Workers' State of Helasia 1) in accordance with the Special Decision #04 of the Republican Advisory Committee (period A') (2019) ¹ 2) In accordance with the *Nikol Poha Doctrine* (on external affairs) 3) In accordance with the Stefan Dor doctrine (on external affairs), **decides the following;**

PART A – REESTABLISHING THE NIKOL POHA DOCTRINE

Article 1. The Committee and the Bureau of External Affairs believe that under the current circumstances the Nikol Poha (and Stefan Dor) doctrine need to be re-established. With more and more nations (some of them recognized by the Workers' State, some others not) trying to intervene in the internal affairs of Helasia, the Workers' State needs to consider every intervention in its internal affairs, as a matter of external affairs.

Article 2. As an intervention in the internal affairs of the Workers' State are considered the following actions (*when performed by foreign authorities in an official or unofficial way*): (a) Insulting or questioning the national policies (b) insulting or questioning the state ideology (c) insulting the national symbols or questioning their originality.

PART B' - PENALTIES AGAINST THE STATES THE INTERVENE IN THE INTERNAL AFFAIRS OF HELASIA

Article 3. In case of an attempted intervention in the internal affairs of Helasia penalties are imposed within 30 days in 3 phases; (a) phase one: Canceling all the trade or economy related agreements with the accused state (Days: 0-09 since the intervention) (b) phase two: Official condemnation by the Head of the Department of Diplomacy of the Bureau of External Affairs (Days: 10-19 since the intervention). (c) phase three: cutting all diplomatic relations with the accused state (Days: 20-29 since the intervention). (d) phase four: updating the table of the hostile states (Day 30 since the intervention).

During the 30 Days Period, Helasia and the accused state can reach an agreement and the procedure will be terminated.

Article 4. Exceptional cases: 1. If a state that is accused for such violations has not signed a trade or economic agreement phase one can be bypassed. 2. If an agreement is offered by Helasia but the accused state is still acting with hostility or the intervention is still taking place, the Premier (or the Acting Governor) has the right to sign a Special Decree, bypassing phases one and two. In that case, the 29 days needed for the activation of phase four.

With a decision of the Republican Workers' Committee, the Workers' State can cut all diplomatic ties with states that are in common organizations with the accused state.

PART C' - THE TABLE OF HOSTILE STATES

Article 5. The Table of Hostile States is a table updated (a) every month on its 28th day and (b) every time a state has to be added to it.

Article 6. A state can be removed from the table with a presidential decree, approved by the Bureau of External Affairs.

Article 7. The 1st version of the table will be set on the 29th of June, by the Bureau of External Affairs, being retroactive since June 1st, 2020.
